### **About Summer Learning Labs**

In 2021, Indy Summer Learning Labs (ISLL) was created by The Mind Trust and United Way of Central Indiana to combat the significant learning loss caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2024, The Mind Trust assumed full program management and partnered with the Indiana Department of Education to replicate ISLL to four regions across Indiana through the Expanding What Works grant program. Summer Learning Labs (SLL) encompass every program region that adheres to the core principles of Indy Summer Learning Labs.

In each region, **anchor partners** serve as the principal program coordinator, recruiting site partners, ensuring proper staffing, and are responsible for overall program management in their service area.

All Summer Learning Labs follow three core principles:

A focus on acceleration: The SLL English Language Arts (ELA) and math curriculum is focused on accelerated learning, rather than remediation. Created by Lavinia Group, the curriculum is aligned to Indiana state standards, promotes critical thinking skills, and is grounded in the science of reading. Four years of program results have shown that grade-level instruction drives learning gains in ELA and math.

**Reaching highest-need students:** Since the program began in 2021, Summer Learning Labs has aimed to serve students who may not have access to a high-quality summer program. This remains an essential commitment for anchor partners. The vast majority of sites are free to attend and all offer breakfast and lunch each day.


Community and school partnerships:

A hallmark of SLL is the inclusion of community organizations as site partners,

along with individual schools and districts. Community centers, churches, and youth-serving nonprofits have hosted sites. Families have shared that they appreciate program options in their neighborhood that they already know and trust.

ISLL has served Marion Country students for four years. Each of the other SLL regions were in their first program year in summer 2024.

#### Current and Future Funding for Summer Learning Labs

The Indiana Department of Education (IDOE)'s Student Learning Recovery Grant Program was created in 2021 through House Enrolled Act 1008 to address learning loss caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. This grant has served as the primary funding source for all SLL locations.

Funding exists for programming in 2025 through the Student Learning Recovery Grant; however, additional funding is needed to maintain and grow the number of students served in 2025, and to sustain the program in future years.

### 2024 Results Show Replication of ISLL Works

Expanding What Works regions in 2024 show proof of scalability for the program model. The four expansion regions outside of Indianapolis that replicated the ISLL model of daily instruction using a highquality, accelerated curriculum made similarly strong math and ELA learning gains in their first year to those of the flagship ISLL program in its fourth year.

### Accelerated Learning Driven By High-Quality Curriculum

High-quality, grade-level instruction has been a key component of the program since its launch in 2021. Rather than focusing on remediation, which is the teaching of earlier concepts students have yet to master, SLL instruction is focused on giving students grade-level content to accelerate their learning. Four years of learning gains prove this method is effective in driving real academic gains.

Every SLL program uses the same math and ELA curriculum, created by Lavinia Group. The curriculum is aligned to Indiana state standards.

#### Key components of the ELA curriculum include:

- Phonics instruction based in the science of reading.
- Lessons that focus on identifying a main idea, craft and structure, and mastery of a text.
- A focus on strengthening a student's ability to analyze, discuss, and write about a book they are reading.
- A reading list containing age-appropriate books from a variety of award-winning authors.

### Key components of the math curriculum include:

- Emphasis on story problems to ensure students can tackle this type of problem independently.
- Routines that build mastery of math operations and help students understand the concept behind the problem.
- Exercises that build mathematical fluency and familiarity with grade-level material.



Across all five regions, **more than 600 instructional staff** served students in summer 2024. The program provides teachers, site leaders, and other instructional staff with the support they need to deliver a standardized math and ELA curriculum effectively to all students.

### Key elements of instructional staff support include:

- One week of pre-training on curriculum and strategies to implement it in the classroom, led by Lavinia Group.
- ISLL teachers had the opportunity to attend in-person training sessions that featured modeling and coaching led by Lavinia Group.
- Weekly professional development with Lavinia Group for implementation guidance.
- Competitive pay for training week and instructional time.

• An organized package of teacher books, student workbooks, and preand post-assessments.

### **Summer Fun and Enrichment**

Students and families want summer programming that is safe, productive, and fun. Enrichment activities include field trips, sports, cooking classes, STEM activities, dance, art projects, volunteer opportunities, and more.


SLL sites select and plan enrichment activities at their own discretion. In Indianapolis, the ISLL team provided an Enrichment Directory to all sites, which offered a curated selection of recommended support and enrichment resources.

#### COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS ENHANCE PROGRAMMING

All SLL programs benefit from existing nonprofits and youth-serving organizations in their respective communities. A core component of the program is the opportunity for community-based organizations to work alongside schools to impact student achievement over the summer break. Community partners can participate in the program in the following ways. Anchor Partner or Program Site: In all regions, a nonprofit organization serves as the anchor partner, facilitating the management of the program in their service area and acting as the main grantee for funding. Community organizations can also serve as program site locations.

**Enrichment Partner:** SLL sites often use youth-serving nonprofits as enrichment activity providers to supplement their programming.

Students at the La Plaza ISLL site visited Fort Harrison State Park to hike and fish. SLL sites plan field trips that expose students to activities and ares in their region that they may not get to experience otherwise.



# 2024 Program-Wide Enrollment Demographics

Summer Learning Lab serve the highest need populations in their respective regions. Most students enrolled in the program are students from low-income households or students of color.

In 2024, close to 9,000 students entering grades 1 through 9 following summer break were served at 91 sites across five service area regions. Across all service regions, 78% identified as students of color and 69% qualified for free or reduced lunch.


### 2024 Program-Wide Academic Results


All SLL students take an assessment during the first and last weeks of the program. A score in the below or approaching range means a student has not passed the assessment. Scores within the basic or proficient range indicate that the student passed the assessment and is showing mastery of grade-level math and reading standards.




### 2024 PROGRAM-WIDE ELA LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS



### 2024 PROGRAM-WIDE MATH LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS




### 2024 Learning Gains by Student Group, Program-Wide
















# 2024 Indy Summer Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics

ISLL served more students than ever before in summer 2024. This year, the program served 5,300 Marion County students entering grades 1 through 9 following the summer break. Of those enrolled, 93% identified as students of color, 70% qualified for free or reduced lunch, and 22% were English Language Learners.



# 2024 Indy Summer Learning Lab Academic Results

For the fourth year in a row, students who participated in ISLL achieved learning gains in ELA and math, as demonstrated by preand post-test assessment score percentage point gains. Notably, overall percentage point gains in ELA and math increased compared to 2023.


Most sites were free to attend, with some charging a small fee to help cover costs for additional enrichment or before- and aftercare services they chose to provide.






#### **2024 ISLL ELA LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS**

### 2024 Learning Gains by Student Group - ISLL















# 2024 BGC Summer Learning Labs, Enrollment Demographics

In South Bend and surrounding regions, SLL served more than 2,500 students entering grades 1 through 9 following the summer break. Of these students, 53% identified as students of color, 68% qualified for free or reduced lunch, and 9% were English Language Learners.


# 2024 BGC Summer Learning Labs, South Bend Region, Academic Results

Boys and Girls Club of the Northern Indiana Corridor, formerly Boys and Girls Club of St. Joseph County, utilized IDOE's Student Learning Recovery Grant in 2023 to support robust summer programming. Along with ISLL, they were recognized by IDOE as a high-quality Student Learning Recovery Grant program example.

In 2024, they shifted programming to align with the SLL model, partnering with South Bend Community School Corporation and community partners across their service region to create 16 SLL locations. All sites were free to attend.


#### 2024 BGC SLL ELA LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS






#### 2024 BGC SLL MATH LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS

### 2024 Learning Gains by Student Group - BGC SLL









# 2024 Northwest Summer Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics

The Northwest SLL served more than 700 students entering into grades 1 through 9 after the summer break. Of these students, 88% identified as students of color and 76% qualified for free or reduced lunch. Sites were located in Gary, Merrillville, East Chicago, and Hobart, Indiana. All sites were free to attend.




### 2024 Learning Gains by Student Group - Northwest SLL











# 2024 Southeast Summer Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics

In Salem, a rural Indiana community in the southeastern part of the state, SLL served 50 students entering grades 1 through 5 after the summer break. Their program also provided transportation to students from the neighboring town of Campbellsburg. All program sites were free. Out of all participating students, 41% of qualified for free or reduced lunch.


# 2024 Southeast Summer Learning Labs Academic Results



#### 2024 SOUTHEAST SLL ELA LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS




#### 2024 SOUTHEAST SLL MATH LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS






